This past April, the Kumamoto Earthquakes physically damaged several sightseeing spots, and false rumors about the effects of the earthquakes damaged other sightseeing spots as well. The number of tourists dropped severely for a period of time, but, as a result of activities like tourism campaigns and Kyushu Reconstruction discounts, tourist numbers began to rise again in September. Reconstruction within the prefecture is continuing steadily.



During this time period, the second chapter of the "SynFlow" Oita's promotional video series, "Let's Go SynFlow Team!" was also released. Oita jumped from #32 to #15 in the nationwide prefectural attractiveness rankings, and our prefecture saw the highest jump in rank of any prefecture on the list. Among other happy news, there was Oita Trinita's victory in the J3 league and reinstatement to the J2 league in one year as well as the registration of "Yama, Hoko, Yatai Float Festivals", including the "Hita Gion Festival Floats", as UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritages.

In preparation for the large number of foreign visitors Oita will receive, we'll continue to actively promote Oita's charms to the world.

Oita Airport's Goes From Foot Bath to Yuzu Citrus Bath

The foot baths available at Oita Airport have water transported daily from Beppu, use only water fresh from the source, and are located in a tub made of Japanese cypress. On the winter solstice on January 21st, the foot bath will have yuzu citrus from Innai (in Usa), the biggest yuzu producing town in Oita, floating in it. Approximately 40 individual yuzu will be used, so tourists can enjoy an invigorating fragrance as they experience the foot bath.

When people think of Oita, the first images that spring to mind are the famous hot springs city Beppu and also Yufuin, an incredibly popular tourist town located an hour's train ride from Oita City. Yufu City Hall is a short walk from the station, and we spoke with Mr. Shono, of the Yufu City Yufuin Promotion Department, and Mr. Fujiwara, of the Yufuin Regional Promotion Office, who told us a variety of interesting information. For example, the most popular month to visit Yufuin is March. Tourism traffic is incredibly strong for March, April, and, May and only begins to fade in June. But don't let that dissuade you from visiting outside of those months. Yufuin is beautiful and popular in all seasons.

Yufuin is a must-see destination for fashionable young couples from all over the world. The most popular home country for non-Japanese tourists is South Korea. The appeals of Yufuin vary from hot springs in the colder months, shopping, activities like canyoneering, and sports such as cycling. Instead of being known for one thing, Yufuin has a variety of activities, foods, and shops to choose from.

So what is the difference between Beppu and Yufuin? The two cities are located fairly close to one another, and both pride themselves on their hot springs. The unique nature of Yufuin's hot springs lies in the striking blue color of the hot spring water. When it comes to the ladies' choice in hot springs, Yufuin is the clear winner.

Yufuin has many resources available to English-speaking tourists. We received a bicycle map of the area printed in English and biked from the station to the lake. The station hosts a Rent-a-Cycle service where you can take a leisurely ride on an electric-powered bicycle and enjoy the scenery with the wind in your hair. It is one of many ways, including carriage ride, by which you can enjoy Yufuin.

If you do only one thing in Yufuin, you must see Lake Kinrin. It's a popular photo destination, and the scenery is spectacular. The view of the mist rising off of the lake is a particular favorite.


