1 Patients

(152nd case)

- (1) Age: Individual aged between 10 to 20
- (2) Sex: Male
- (3) Residence: Hita
- (4) Occupation: Unemployed
- (5) Contact and infection history:

Aug 30 Headache, nasal discharge, loss of smell

Aug 31 Visited Medical Institution A

Sep 1 Fever of 37.9°C

Sep 2 Headache, nasal discharge, loss of smell, visited Medical Institution A

Sep 3 Received PCR testing, results returned positive

Current symptoms nasal discharge, loss of smell, fatigue

- (6) Patient's current status: Admitted to a medical institution designated for infectious diseases or a cooperating medical institution

(153rd case)

- (1) Age: Individual in his 30s
- (2) Sex: Male
- (3) Residence: Oita City
- (4) Occupation: Medical staff (the Oita Prefectural Hospital)
- (5) Contact and infection history:

Contact with patients of the 112nd case and 123rd case

Aug 18 Received PRC Testing as a contact of the infected, results returned negative

Sep 1 Irritated throat, cough

Sep 3 Fever of between 37°C to 38°C, fatigue, headache, nasal discharge

Sep 4 Received PCR testing, results returned positive

Current symptoms Fever of 38.3°C

- (6) Patient's current status: Admitted to a medical institution designated for infectious diseases or a cooperating medical institution

2 Statuses of individuals who have come in close contact with patients

Currently under investigation

3 Responses from Health Centres

- (1) Individuals who are confirmed to have come in close contact with the patients have been requested to undergo home quarantine and participate in health checks for a period of 14-days (daily confirmation over phone for body temperatures and presence of respiratory syndromes).
- (2) The patients' travel and contact histories are under further investigation.
